

The Bursary Award - Project Brief**THE OBJECTIVE**

To develop future hands-on practitioners in the field of heritage conservation in Canada by awarding an annual Martin Weaver Memorial Bursary to students

THE TERMS FOR THE BURSERY

Hands-on training Schools in Canada will be contacted and invited to participate in this initiative, in August of every year. A Bursary Award Kit will be distributed to the Schools that will participate in this initiative. The Schools would have to include in their regular programs a learning activity related to hands-on heritage conservation. The bursary award will require the students to submit an essay by January 31st of the following year. The Selection will be completed by April 30th.

Bursary Amount will be for no less than \$200 per School determined by funds available from Charitable activities and allocated by the MWMF Committee to the Bursary Award Program. The number of Schools participating in this Initiative will determine number of Bursaries.

BENEFITS

ICOMOS Canada Membership will be granted to the students

Free registration to the annual ICOMOS Canada MWMF Lecture will be offered to the students and their school representatives.

Award Recipients and their schools and teachers will be announced at the annual ICOMOS Canada MWMF Lecture.

Winning Essays will be edited for publication in the ICOMOS Canada Bulletin, and posted on the ICOMOS Canada Web site along with informative briefs about the participating schools.

Travel expenses for recipients will not be included

THE ESSAY

The composition should be dealing with a chosen subject by the student or derived from his/her personal experience

- Topic should deal with linking theory, principles and hands-on practice in heritage conservation
- Format: 800 to 1000 words + references in an electronic format
- Document Type / Writing Style
 - Analytical or
 - Narrative or
 - Argumentative or
 - Descriptive
- Evaluation Criteria
 - Conforming to the topic
 - Conforming to principles and guidelines of practice in heritage conservation
 - Originality
 - Grammar and Style
 - Clarity
